Know that events and developments are seen as significant because they result in a change and had consequences for people in that era and/or over time

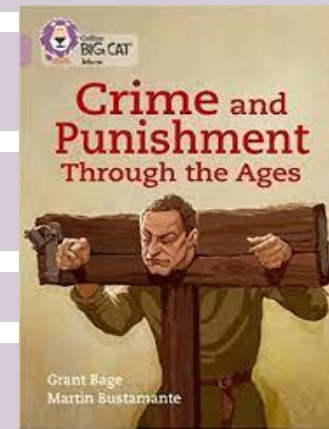
Sticky Knowledge
