Key Vocabulary	
Human features	Human features are things like houses, roads and bridges. They have been built by people .
Physical features	Physical features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural . They would be here even if there were no people around.
Map	A map is a drawing of all or part of Earth's surface
Explore	Looking closely at something.
Rural area	Rural areas are <i>areas which are not towns or cities</i>
Market	A public place where people gather to buy and sell things.
Town	A place with many streets and buildings, where people live and work .
Village	A village is a place that is far away from the pollution and noise of the city .

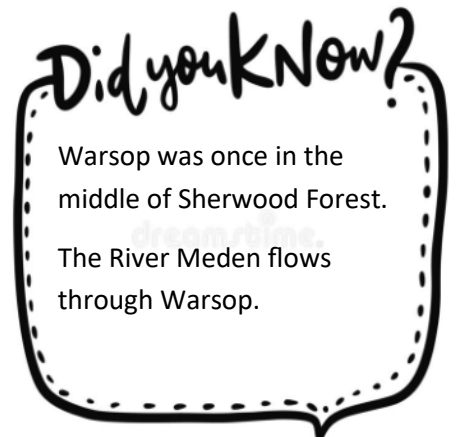
