Country	A country is land that is controlled by a single government.

Compass	A compass is a tool that helps you find direction. It has a needle that always points towards the north.
Orienteering	Orienteering is a sport where people run around a place with instructions on a map.
Map	A map is a drawing of all or part of Earth's surface.
Key	Most maps have something called a map key. This is almost like a code to understanding what the parts of the map mean

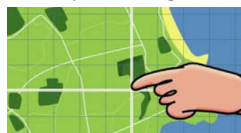
