

Church Vale Primary PUPIL PREMIUM EXPENDITURE 2011-2012

Pupil Premium is a specific allocation of funds, additional to main school funding, which the Government believes is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children who are in receipt of free school meals and their wealthier peers. The Government believes that the allocation of Pupil Premium will tackle disadvantage by reaching the pupils who need it the most. Funding is used to support:

- Closing the attainment/performance gap
- Involving and engaging with those who are hard to reach
- Supporting pupils with SEND and disabilities, and their families to succeed in education
- Improving and empowering communities to address local issues
- Supporting and stimulating the development of community groups and encouraging community engagement
- Combating issues of isolation, distrust and disengagement

Below are details of our Pupil Premium allocation for 2011 - 2012, how it was spent or contributed to overall spending and the impact it has had on the children in our school.
